Jason Carlton has been a photographer for more than half his life, starting with point-and-shoots as a teenager and gravitating into SLRs and DSLRs as technology evolved. Jason’s photographic passions include landscapes, the night sky and macro, and more recently, photographing temples of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Jason is a storyteller, whether through video, photo or written word. His artwork often features an unexpected twist on ordinary objects and scenes, from macro water drops on a rainbow of colored pencils, to unique perspectives on majestic landscapes. His recent project, *Temples and Testimonies*, combines his passion for capturing the beauty of the temples with the human stories of those who attend them.
