Award-winning photographer, Jerry am Ende presents his program **“What Makes a Great Wildlife Image? A Subjective Review”** on Monday, March 25 at a meeting of the Delaware Photographic Society. The meeting begins at 7:30 pm in Cokesbury’s Auditorium C.

Jerry began his interest in photography in the early 1960s as an adjunct to his hobby of astronomy. He discovered the world of video when his children were participating in various youth sports teams – creating season highlight video cassettes and later DVDs. When his children went off to college, he turned his focus

from sports to wildlife and eventually went back to his roots in still photography. Some of Jerry’s accolades include: first place winning images at the Exelon Conowingo Dam Bald Eagle photo contest for both 2012, 2014, 2018 and won 2nd place in 2017. Jerry won Highly Honored selection in the 2016 Nature’s Best Windland Smith Rice International. He’s had multiple images selected for recognition on the Audubon and National Geographic websites; and his images have been displayed at the Ward Museum of Wildfowl Art, Delaware Museum of Natural History and the Biggs Museum of American Art.
